Below is an introduction from Chaplain Wheatley – you will nearly be brought to tears with his remarks about how important our ministry is to the base! Thank you, Chaplain Wheatley!

I wanted to take the opportunity introduce myself to you as the second US Army Chaplain assigned to Casualty and Mortuary Affairs, Dover Air Force Base, Dover, DE. This second position opened in September, 2011. It is my privilege to work alongside Chaplain (LTC) Garry Losey in the ministry of caring for the Families of Fallen Soldiers who are repatriated to their country thru Dover AFB. Having served in numerous locations and positions over twenty-two years of military ministry, I have come to believe that the work done thru the Chaplains here at DAFB is both a high honor and a humbling experience.

As I joined the team here at Dover I was continually asked by both family and friends alike, 'why would you want to do that, go there, and be exposed to such constant pain and heartache?' The answer was not hard to discern - why wouldn't I want to? A unique part component of our ministry and presence with Families of Fallen Soldiers is to introduce them to the wonderful shawls that we receive from all across the nation. The colors, patterns, designs, and touching notes accompanying each shawl all contribute to become a 'silent messenger of comfort' to Families. I watch, on a continual basis, the expressions upon people's faces as they touch and receive these symbols of care which embody the spirit of a grateful nation. Something almost transformational occurs! It is as if, for that moment while holding the shawl, while touching something that reminds people of something familiar and good, that the pain of the loss, just for a moment, is diminished. As Families receive these beautiful sentinels of grace, they take them home and are reminded, day by day, of the love, spirit, and support of an entire nation!

Thank you for this wonderful ministry and outreach. Those who make and ship them are the 'quiet angels' whose work is rewarded by God. We would continue to ask that your organization send us shawls. We have, most recently, distributed the preponderance of shawls we had on hand and certainly welcome receiving more as soon as possible.
