ARMY'S CASUALTY LIST:

There are a number of you who prefer direct contact with our families, so this list will once again be displayed in our newsletters. Please remember to keep me up-to-date of how many prayer shawls you send to these families so that we may keep accurate statistics. If you take a name/town, I will <u>not</u> mark a prayer shawl sent unless you follow-up and tell me you have done so.

The list of towns below includes "Next-of-Kin" of Army casualties who we have <u>not</u> delivered prayer shawls through our direct <u>contact/mail program</u>. It is likely a few members of these families have visited Dover Air Base and chosen a prayer shawl while there. Often they return home wishing they had taken more, wanting to comfort a grief-stricken sister, grandparent, special aunt or uncle, or for the soldier's children. If you would like to contact these families to offer a prayer shawl, send me a list of the towns.

(Note: Repeat towns have been eliminated, so multiple next-of-kin may be associated with a town. In earlier days of this program, I received a monthly list of prayer shawl recipients from Dover Air Base. We no longer receive that list, and the Army's updated Casualty List is sporadic. This means we don't know who on this list has been to Dover and chosen a prayer shawl.)

T. **COMMUNICATIONS FROM YOU:**

PS4FS Robin Bunton, who heads the Springwood Presbyterian Church's prayer shawl group in Whitsett, North Carolina, joined us on April 25th of this year. They are a new group (only began one year ago), hitting the ground fast with our ministry! Along with the picture of their group, Robin shares some interesting info about them:

Springwood Presbyterian Church's Prayer Shawl Group began in 2011. Currently we have seven committed weavers. Three are knitters; four women crochet.

Mary Lockamy (pictured 6^{th} from left) is not only productive with her crochet hook, but she is also creative with colors, crochet techniques and yarn textures. Pictured are many of her completed masterpieces. The two in patriotic colors are shawls she worked specifically for PS4FS.

Other members – Arlene Ingle $(1^{st}$ on left), Ann Jennings (3rd from left), and Rev. Dr. Genie Martin (in robe) do beautiful work with knitting needles. Arlene and Ann have given many shawls to local retirement facilities and shut-ins from our church. Genie has a special knitting technique. She knits strips of different colors; then crochets them

together. Lovely!

L'Wanna Donnell (4th from left) crochets her shawls. Her work is dazzling with bright yellow and orange. Recently,

she decided to try the Granny Square pattern. No surprises – it was striking.

Valerie Ingle (5th from left) is an enthusiastic weaver. She chooses to crochet and prefers the multi-colored, chunky yarns. Her enthusiasm for making shawls is contagious. After numerous requests from some of the church youth, Valerie has begun teaching these young girls how to crochet.

I (pictured 2^{nd}) learned to crochet and knit as a young child. My grandmother taught me. My knitting never evolved the way my grandmother assured me it would. Therefore, I use my crochet hook; and the yarn and I get along just fine. There are many different patterns and techniques that I want to try one day. For now, I enjoy using the Cross Stitch for my shawls. This stitch works up quickly and looks nice.

It has been a pleasure preparing these shawls for PS4FS. Currently we are handwriting notes to attach. We will be sending twenty shawls to Dover the week of May 7, 2012.

On May 23rd, we had a new member join us, Cheryl Evans, from Snoqualmie, Washington. Cheryl was good enough to share two pictures of
