Prayer Shawls for Fallen Soldiers

a network of needle crafters ministering to families of the fallen

Since 2006 volunteer needle crafters have given 6,762 handmade prayer shawls.

What's Working So Far

Twice each month we receive a casualty list from the Department of the Army. We then send a letter to all of the next-of-kin on the list explaining Prayer Shawls for Fallen Soldiers, and inviting them to request a shawl by phone, e-mail, or on-line at the website (www.ps4fs.org). When a request is received, we send an e-mail to three or four needle crafters located close to the requestor, informing them of the request. (At this point we provide only the relationship to the service person and the requestor's city/state to maintain as much confidentiality as possible.) In the e-mail, we ask if any of the individuals/groups can provide a shawl, and if so, to reply to us. We then provide the name and mailing address of the requestor to the first group/individual to respond.

Most of the time, requests are matched with providers within 48 hours. In the few cases where no response is received within a week, we then start the process over again with different individuals/groups.

Crafters Needed

PS4FS does not have contact with crafters/groups in these states: Alaska, Georgia, Hawaii, Mississippi, Montana, North & South Dakota, Utah and Wyoming. If you know someone who would be interested, please encourage them to contact us.
